This weekend - arguments about 'status'

In the Gospel today – Jesus notices the dispute between his disciples. Are they discussing their work for the poor, their preaching of the kingdom, the devotion to Jesus and the work he had come to do? The Gospel text tells us that they were arguing about 'which of them was the greatest'. In reply, does Jesus give an explanation about dangerous ambition? With total simplicity 'Jesus took a little child and set him in front of them'. Our Lord reminds his disciples and US – that such simplicity and straightforwardness should characterize his followers. Living and praying PLAINLY is our calling.

<u>An historic moment – prayer, fasting and penance</u>

Pope Francis and many others remind us that we are living through a very particular time! The Holy Father writes- "It is not Lent! Yet it is a turning point in our personal lives and in the history of the Church and of the world. There are moments when we ought to kneel down and raise our supplication to God. There are moments when we ought to fast and do penance because we believe that God can be moved to respond with pity and compassion. We believe in a merciful God who can be moved by prayer and acts of penance. The Bible is full of such moments. We are living through such a time of challenge and hope." We can all play a part in various ways — crying out to God for the poor and for the earth. From Stanmore — let us raise a great song of intercession and sacrifice — using the traditional words of the psalm — 'Lord, spare your people, show us your mercy, grant us your unfailing help.'
