<u>Welcome! Our churches re-open for Advent and Christmas</u> <u>Joy to the world!</u>

A new beginning: Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord: Advent 2 John the Baptist is one of the great figures of Advent; so many times we hear that John was sent to announce the coming of Jesus. Of course, he was quite different in his appearance and preaching. John pointed to Christ as the Messiah - 'someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am...' John spoke of a new beginning! The readings this weekend seem, to me, to highlight a fresh hope and a powerful start; something perhaps which speaks to our current situation. Dear brothers, sisters, families, friends - welcome Jesus this Advent and this Christmas. No more tired repeats of the past. COVID has shifted the whole world. It is no longer simply a question of getting back to last year, to the past. A new courage is required. Let us enter into the marvellous words from the Prophet Isaiah in the first reading - 'here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things...He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to rest the mother ewes'. As we light another candle on our Advent wreath - we hear again the response to the psalm - "let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help". A new beginning in one way or another for us all.

There will be two Masses on Christmas Eve: 5.30pm and Midnight. There will be challenges! Our numbers are limited under COVID guideline - 48! No singing! No Christmas carols! Shorter Masses. On Christmas Day - Masses will be at 8am and 10am - with the same restrictions. ALL Masses will require tickets - which are available from this weekend. Please note that the tickets will be for specific Masses. Subject to the demand for tickets, a third Mass may be arranged on Christmas Day at 11.15am.
