## **Important reminder- please arrive in church wearing a mask**

### **Pope Francis speaking recently and this Sunday's Gospel**

The words of the Holy Father often give us reminders and pointers in our lives. A few days ago, he quoted a familiar saying which we can return to often. Remember Pope Francis said - *every saint has a past and every sinner has a future!* Let us think about it! Let us think and pray about it - whichever category we believe we are in.

Another parable this weekend - again about working in the vineyard (like last Sunday). This time, two sons instructed by their Father to work in his field. The second son says the right words 'certainly sir'. But he did not go. The first son answered - 'I will not go'. Now for a very telling phrase in the gospel. Afterwards the son THOUGHT BETTER OF IT AND WENT. Being a disciple is not just a question of getting the words right. It is what we do that counts in following Jesus.

### **The Sacrament of Anointing**

Though primarily a Sacrament for the sick - this healing anointing has wide application to the elderly, as well as for those who struggle in any way. The priest prays over each person and then anoints them. COVID presents some cautions around this Sacrament. Father Michael writes - "May I suggest that weather permitting - we have an opportunity for this Sacrament outside in the car park. Because of applying the Holy Oil, I am required to sanitise my hands after each person so it will take a little time. On Saturday 10 October, after Confessions (11am-12noon) I will be available for the Sacrament of Anointing between 12noon and 1pm. Remember this Sacrament is not only for older people. Anyone of any age, troubled in mind, body or spirit is welcome. Please take this opportunity to trust in and receive the healing of Christ."

### **Church Safety Arrangements – A Reminder**

- Face Masks must be worn at all times whilst in the Church,

After considerable prayer, discussion and consulting the current Westminster diocese and Government regulations, it is clear that this is not an appropriate time to restart preparation classes for our 6 children whose journey towards making their First Holy Communion was interrupted by the Lockdown in March. Until then, please hold all the young children of the parish in your prayers that we will soon be able to welcome them and their families back into church for Mass and the sacraments.
