The gospel this weekend is very challenging. Can you imagine the amount of 'social distancing' surrounding leprosy? Those afflicted had to live apart away from the community. They had to ring a bell - warning others when they were approaching; they ate separately and certainly were not allowed in the temple or synagogue. The example of Our Lord in today's gospel certainly prompts many questions, both at the time and since.

Ash Wednesday - LENT - THE Way of the Cross

This Wednesday, we begin the holy 40 days of Lent - a season leading to the main celebration of the Church's year - namely the sacred three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Day. COVID means that this year, there will be no marking with ashes on the forehead. Instead the priest will sprinkle ashes on top of the head of each person. Masses on Wednesday will be at 9.30am and 8pm - with live-steaming for the LINK: https://us02web.zoom.us/i/2539625604 Just a reminder that, allowing for age and health - Ash Wednesday is a day of FASTING and ABSTINENCE. The whole season of Lent is also a time for prayer and penance. Please remember that while fasting from food/drinks is often at the heart of Lent- there are many other types of 'going without'. On the Fridays of Lent there will be Stations of the Cross at 7pm with Holy Communion. The Way of the Cross is a traditional devotion; it is prayerful and powerful. Please note that in Lent 2021 there will be no Mass on Friday evenings.

Church Safety Arrangements
