## 20/21 February 2021

The First Sunday of Lent: a new covenant with Noah: Christ in the wilderness Always on the first Sunday of Lent we hear about Jesus fasting for 40 days in the wilderness. The devil tries to tempt Him. Though not in the same dramatic way, Lent offers us a similar challenge. Lent is not a 'quick fix'; it is a lengthy journey and an invitation. The experience of the Corona-virus that we have been living though has been much longer than 40 days and perhaps more to come? It has been an ordeal and perhaps like our Lord in the wilderness we, in our lockdown equivalent, have been dis-oriented and tempted. On Ash Wednesday - we were reminded to 'turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel'. Remember that God is ever faithful. He has made a holy pact with humanity. It is called a 'covenant'. The Lord speaking to Noah in the first reading establishes a covenant with the whole earth.

# The Cardinal's Lenten Appeal 2021

Over the last year many of the regular extra 'door' collections have not taken place. Good causes (sick and elderly priests, CAFOD, priestly training and others) have had to go without. During this Lent - you will find envelopes at the back of the church for the Cardinal's Lenten Appeal. With Caritas - this collection helps to provide food for children and families in our parishes and communities who are facing hunger. It also supports our brothers and sisters through the pandemic - including 'trafficked' women and exploited families. The envelopes are at the back of the church. Please collect and make your contribution if you can, popping the envelopes into the now regular collection baskets, On the posters on the central inside doors you will find a 'scan to GIVE' possibility. This collection remains open throughout the 40 days of Lent.

## Lenten opportunities

A very powerful Lenten devotion is the 'Way of the Cross' which our parish will pray each Friday of Lent at 7pm with the distribution of Holy Communion. Take this opportunity. The Stations of the Cross speak to our daily lives. Prayer and fasting are also very much at the heart of Lent.

Pope Francis in his book writes of Lent in positive terms - "This Lent, may

we be increasingly concerned with 'speaking words of comfort, strength, consolation and encouragement, and not words that demean, sadden, anger or show scorn". 'In order to give hope to others, it is sometimes enough simply to be kind, to be willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference.' To gaze on and recognise a brother or sister!

# WE ARE OPEN!

Thankfully our parish church opening seems to have settled into a regular pattern. Sunday Mass times are consistent with pre-COVID. The Lord has blessed the parish with a small group of 'totally dependent' stewards who open up, assist with arrivals and seating and sanitise after church use. Other volunteers also assist. Thank you to all involved and to all who co-operate.

# **Church Safety Arrangements**
