#### Bishop Pat O'Donaghue RIP

The funeral of Bishop Pat took place on Tuesday in Cork, Ireland where he was living in retirement in Nazareth House. He was ordained as a priest of our Westminster diocese in 1967. Father Michael writes: "always known as POD – Bishop Pat was a much admired priest of Westminster - where he was a Parish Priest, Pastoral Director and later Rector of Allen Hall seminary. He was also Administrator of the Cathedral and a close adviser of the late Cardinal Hume. His gentle voice tone, good humour and pastoral heart enclosed the powerful energy of an apostle. He was one of those pastors - who was greatly respected by his fellow priests. Area Bishop in West London, he was eventually named as Bishop of Lancaster where he served the diocese with his customary energy. Pat was a man of God and deep prayer; it shone out of him! May he receive the reward of his Master whom he served so well. Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord"

In countless ways Chris was deeply involved in the life of Saint William of York for many years. Over time, there was hardly a rota on which Chris' name did not occur. Working alongside various priests and parishioners, organising Christmas Fairs and Summer events, social gatherings in the hall and in the old wooden hall which used to stand behind the church - Chris did an immense amount of unseen pastoral work. He visited people and helped out where he could, always with generosity and discretion. Above all, Chris was a man of faith and prayer. Daily Mass was part of his regular practice in later years. From my point of view, as one of the Parish Priests who had the privilege of knowing him - I found him respectful and good humoured. He was wise and willing! He will be greatly missed. Chris had a holy and peaceful death; again I was blessed to be able to administer the Last Rites. The whole parish extends our sympathy and prayers to Peggy, the family and all who mourn his passing. Dear Chris, 'well done good and faithful servant; enter into the joy of your Lord.' Funeral: 11 February at 11 am under COVID restrictions.

#### James O'Reilly RIP

Jim and his wife Kathleen - long term parishioners - were very much part of the parish. Regular in their practice of the faith - Jim spent the last few years at home, looked after by Kathleen and the family as well as visiting carers. There was almost always an O'Reilly / Boyle bench full at Mass. Truly Jim was a good, decent and honest man. Now- may he know the bright light of heaven. The funeral of James O'Reilly will take place on Tuesday 16 February beginning with Mass in the church at 10am - with COVID restrictions.

#### In addition - in the next two weeks

Father Michael will be performing four COVID funerals; individuals NOT from Stanmore but simply where undertakers telephone trying to find an available Catholic priest for graveside or crematorium services. Lord have mercy.

#### **Church Safety Arrangements**

- Face Masks <u>must be worn at all times</u> whilst in the Church,
