The Scriptures this weekend

Saint Pope John Paul II in his ministry as Pope often spoke and preached about the 'law of the gift'. He said: 'our being increases in the measure that we give it away' In the first reading the poor widow, preparing with her son for death, hears the request of Elijah the prophet. In our limited human perception- Elijah is taking her last morsel, but the 'law of gift' eventually means that God provides enough (plus). In the gospel the rich with their plenty loudly drop their money into the temple treasury. Jesus notices the two small coins of the widow- contributing 'all she had to live on'. There is a profound mixture here of trust and 'holy risk'. Living our lives under the law of the gift- gives us an enormous freedom. Yes, everything for Jesus, daily, means that we receive the rich reward of his grace. (Father Michael)
