October the month of the holy rosary

In the 1970s and 80s it seemed that the Rosary 'went out of fashion.' It was surely Pope Saint John Paul II who restored this powerful prayer to Catholic practice. To the three well known decades of the rosary (joyful, sorrowful and glorious) Saint John Paul added the five LUMINOUS mysteries: 1. The Baptism of the Lord, 2. The wedding feast at Cana, 3. The proclamation of the Kingdom, 4. The Transfiguration and 5. The Eucharist – the Last Supper. Enter into the quiet rhythm of the beads and the reflective prayers. Monday to Wednesday – rosary in the church after Mass; before Mass on Friday evening. On Saturday/Sunday the rosary will be recited before the first morning Mass.
