# **OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE**

The Order of Mass can be followed in the red Parish Mass Book -- first from p.7— then after the Bidding Prayers, from p.15, and from the Lord's Prayer, p.56. (New Mass cards, far simpler to follow, are in preparation.)

The Readings for today's Mass are to be found in the red Parish Mass Book on pp.167—69 The psalm response is: I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.'

THE FEAST of Christ the King was added to the Church's worship in 1926 by Pope Pius XI soon after World War I. That war cruelly exposed the weakness of earthly kingdoms to protect their people. While some still exist within the European family they are all constitutional monarchs. Real power and responsibility lie elsewhere. It is against this background that we can see Jesus Christ as king – the kind of king no republican need ever fear. It is the crucified Christ who is at the focus of attention today. The cross is his throne. Jesus is the Alpha & Omega, the beginning and the end, and it is in the light of that

truth – expounded on by Paul in his letter to the Colossians – that we celebrate the 'absolute monarchy' of divine life and love, mercy, justice and mutual service.

First Reading (OT): 2 Samuel 5.1–3 Israel's monarchy had a very troubled history. Getting it established at all was one thing, then how to position the king in society was another headache. The king was not at the centre, God was. Those kings who refused to give the priority to God (and they were the *majority*) courted deep unpopularity with the people. There were exceptions: David, not without failings, became the ideal king. He profile was as a shepherd who took care of his people.

**Second Reading (NT): Colossians 1.12–20** Confusion, conflict and crisis seem to be increasing in the world, the powers of darkness and sin often seem to have the upper hand. Yet here St Paul presents the structure that lies behind the kingdom that has Christ as its king and centre, a reality in which he encourages the Colossians to place their faith. This is a great theological portrait of Jesus as mediator, and as Lord of all creation.

Gospel: Luke 23.35–43 Any claim in the Roman Empire to be a 'king' represented a full-frontal assault on the authority and dignity of the emperor in Rome. It was on the allegation that Jesus claimed was 'king of the Jews' that he was crucified. Jesus never gave up his claim to be a king, but of a kingdom 'not of *this* world'. A threat to the Romans, a scandal to the Jews, and yet the centre of God's eternal kingdom.

**This week** Fr Jonathan will be making a few days' retreat before Advent begins. **Fr Guy Sawyer** will be celebrating Mass this weekend. *Please do thank him in person.* Weekday masses from tomorrow to Friday are cancelled. The gospel references have been provided in the calendar to support our prayers.

**Next Sunday**, **27 November**, is **Advent Sunday**, and, as before the pandemic, an **Ecumenical Advent Prayer Service**, will take place **at 5pm**, at St John's Anglican Church. **We are all invited**.
