
There are several traditions about the meaning or theme of each candle. The scheme that accords best with the Mass Lectionary is:

Advent 1 The Patriarchs Advent 3 St John the Baptist

Advent 2 The Prophets Advent 4 The Blessed Virgin

As we look towards Christ's promised final coming, each Sunday reminds us of those who prepared for His first coming.

- Pr Blessed are you, sovereign Lord, God of our ancestors:
- All To You be praise and glory for ever.
- Pr You called the patriarchs to live by the light of faith and to journey in the hope of your promised fulfilment.
- All May we be obedient to Your call: ready and watchful to receive Your Christ, a lamp to our feet and a light to our path; for You, Lord, are our light and our salvation. Blessed be God for ever!

**REFLECTIONS** on today's scriptures As Christians we live in a permanent state of expectation "as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ". For the greater part of the season of Advent, with which we inaugurate a new liturgical year, we focus our gaze on the 'second' coming of the Lord at the close of the age. How we can be best prepared for the Lord's return? We know that it will be an unexpected moment, so we are challenged to be daily alert. Advent also invites us to reflect on the many ways in which God is present in our world and present to us in our day-to-day lives.

First Reading: Isaiah 63.16–17,19; 64.3–7 There is an *urgency* in the prayer of the prophet Isaiah. The world needs God, and the prophet pleads for divine intervention. He wants the clouds to be ripped open, and that God ride to the rescue of his sinful people. Earlier in the prophet's writings (Isaiah 48.5) God was invited to send down his unique holy one, the just one [the Messiah], like rain from heaven - everywhere. That text inspired one of the oldest and greatest

Today, if it were not Advent Sunday, would be the feast of St Francis Xavier. He was co-founder of the Jesuits and one of the greatest early modern missionaries of times, strengthening the Church in India and founding it in Japan. He died near Hong Kong, but is enshrined in Goa. Thank God for the strengthening of the Church here by Goan Christians.



Advent hymns of the Latin liturgy, Rorate caeli desuper which we sing each Sunday until Christmas.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 1.3–9 The early Christians of Corinth (just west of Athens) had just received the gospel message through the preaching of Paul and they lived in expectation that the Lord's return was imminent. Paul is aware that his preaching to the people of Corinth and elsewhere makes what God revealed in Jesus known to many more people, and that there are many (including succeeding generations) who yet have to receive the gift of revelation. It is an *urgent* message because 'you do not know the day nor the hour' of the Lord's return. But more than that, the *full* revelation of God's purpose will come only with the Lord's second (glorious) return.

Gospel: Mark 13.33–37 The disciples were always keen to know when and how he might return. This whole chapter is full of this theme. But all Jesus would do, however, was to advise them, "you don't want to be asleep!" Vigilance!
