

• **BEFORE all Sunday Masses**, a prayer before worship: ALMIGHTY GOD, to whom all hearts are open, all desires *known*, and from whom *no secrets* are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. *Please keep <u>silence</u> until the Mass begins*.



• The ORDER of Mass is in the orange Parish Mass Book. Start on p.7; then, after the Creed, go to p.15; and then, at the Lord's Prayer, go to p.56.

• Today's readings are to be found pp.99—101. And the psalm response is, 'I will bless your name for ever, O God my King.'

• **AFTER the 10am Mass** there is an opportunity to greet and meet one another in the Parish Hall.

**REFLECTIONS on today's Scriptures** When speaking about God we frequently use superlatives: almighty, omnipotent and ubiquitous. The emotions which God evokes are wonder, awe and fear of the Lord. And yet throughout salvation history when God has visited his people he has done so discreetly - 'like the dawn from on high'. What's more, he revealed himself primarily to the humblest of people: the elderly Abraham and Sarah, the shepherds on the first Christmas night, the poor of Galilee, and, as today's Gospel teaches us, mere children. When he entered into our world, the Son of God came 'in the form of a servant'. We lived for months now without access to our churches and yet God was never absent from us or our families. Many discovered, through creative family prayer or through following simplified liturgies on-line, how truly accessible God is. I can only imagine that many of you who are parents or grandparents have learned a lot about God through how your children and grandchildren have kept their faith alive during lockdown. God is omnipotent; He reigns in



the majesty of heaven; he *is* the creative genius of our world – all that is true. But he cares for each of us with infinite tenderness, and his desire to be close to us, to be with us in such a way that we recognise him without fear means that he *humbles* himself so as to enter our lives. That is the key mystery of God's identity that today's liturgy brings into focus.

**First Reading (OT): Zechariah 9, 9 – 10:** People will immediately recognise in this reading that scene which we act out in our procession each Holy Week, the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem riding on an ass's colt. Old Testament Israelites were used to war and civil unrest, they lived in fear of the military strength both of their own king *and* his adversaries. But the prophet looked forward to the messianic age, when a king would come but who would demonstrate his power in meekness and not strength. He would conquer hearts rather than territory; he would come to unite rather than divide, to serve rather than dominate. It is easy to see how the

evangelists saw Jesus fulfilling this prophecy.

Second Reading (NT): Romans 8, 9. 11 – 13: During the lockdown we all got used to living without so many of the material possessions we took for granted, and many of the costly pleasures that we legitimately enjoyed. We got very used to 'doing without'. Many rediscovered music, read books, took greater interest in nature around them. And many also rediscovered the joy our spiritual lives can give us. We may now be urged now to *shop, shop!* yet many will take the advice Paul here gives to the Romans.

**Gospel: Matthew 11, 25 – 30:** Most children remember missing several months of school and it is obvious that we should be concerned for their education. But today's Gospel comes as a consolation: when it comes to the things of God, children know more than the clever and the learned. God comes very close to our children.
